Keren Hashluchim Mikvah Grant - Terms and Conditions

By submitting an application for the Keren Hashluchim Mikvah Grant, you acknowledge and agree to the following terms and conditions:

1. Application Review and Approval

- All submitted applications will be reviewed by the Keren Hashluchim.
- Approval is not guaranteed and is at the sole discretion of the committee.
- If your application is approved, you will be notified via email.

2. Grant Disbursement

- The grant will be disbursed in two stages:
 - 50% upon confirmation that the boros have been poured.
 - Submission of photos and any additional information requested for donor reporting purposes.
 - Verification by the Keren Hashluchim team.
 - o 50% upon full completion of the mikvah, subject to the following:
 - Submission of photos and any additional information requested for donor reporting purposes.
 - Installation of a donor recognition plaque in a visible and appropriate location within the mikvah facility, acknowledging Keren Hashluchim as a sponsor.
 - Verification by the Keren Hashluchim team.

3. Timeline Requirements

- From the date of grant approval, construction must begin within three (3) years.
- The mikvah project must be **fully completed within five (5) years** of grant approval.

 If construction has not commenced within three years, or if the project is not completed within five years, the grant may be reallocated to another mikvah project at the discretion of Keren Hashluchim.

4. Ongoing Communication

• Grant recipients are expected to maintain open communication and promptly respond to requests for updates, documentation, or media related to the progress of the mikvah.

5. Right to Modify or Withdraw

Keren Hashluchim reserves the right to modify, suspend, or withdraw grant approval at any time and for any reason, at its sole discretion, including but not limited to:

- Lack of timely progress
- Failure to comply with the above terms
- Changes in project scope or status

6. Definition of Construction Commencement

For the purposes of this grant, "construction beginning" is defined as the point at which substantial physical work has commenced on the mikvah site, including but not limited to site excavation, foundation work, or pouring of the boros.

The following do not qualify as construction commencement:

- Architectural planning or design
- Permit applications or approvals
- Fundraising efforts
- Basic clearing or prep work without structural progress

Proof of construction commencement may be requested, such as dated photographs, contractor verification, or invoices.
